The day after Hurricane Katrina, Scott Sullivan (Founder) made it his mission to give back to his native community of Louisiana by providing food, shelter and clothing to over 20,000 displaced disaster victims. As approximately 2,000 of these victims relocated to

Las Vegas via the Corps of Compassion's support, other needs became apparent in the local community – hungry homeless and at-risk children in Las Vegas.

It was then that the Corps of Compassion began its mission to eradicate hunger in Las Vegas and the surrounding community by launching the backpack program.
